In addition, the parents, especially the club president, spend lots of time planning our trips to the regional and national competition, this helps take the pressure off of Mr. Culp so he can concentrate on teaching and guiding us.

Mr. Culp is one of the important reasons why we do so well. He comes to school when ever we need to come to school. He often times spends 7 days a week at school with us, late into the

evening, especially during Botball season. In fact, no one spends more time at Perry. None of us ever make every single meeting day, but Mr. Culp is there for every single team meeting of every single team. Many weeks he is there almost 80 hours in a week!

He teaches all of the new kids how to build and program the robots. The first semester of school is all about learning to program, build and solve robotic problems. He teaches us everything he knows which is a lot!

He helps us with things we do not know how to do and makes suggestions about how to do things better. He accepts only the best from us and tells us when we are not doing our best even though we might not want to hear it; he wants us to live up to our potential. We don't always listen to him but we have often learned the hard way that Mr. Culp's suggestions are often right. Mr. Culp tells us all the time to not focus on winning and to focus on being the best we can be. Though we do win a lot, we don't believe that winning is the whole point of Botball. When we DO lose, we are good losers and know that it isn't really that important. We believe that Botball is a learning experience, not a competitive sport.

We also do well because we have a lot of people on each team. This is helpful because then we always have people that are good at something.

2.3 School support

Our School provides a place to meet for our Botball teams during the school year and summer. Each of our Botball teams has dedicated meeting days that we meet on, but we come as much as we need to, to work on the robots. Some weeks we come seven days a week when we really need to get things done. This helps if we are running out of time and still need to build robots. We also learn a lot more in a shorter period of time.

The principal of Perry also supports the Robotics teams a lot. He gives us school laptops to use at the competition and to program the robots with. He also comes to the regional events to support the team. In addition, he has allowed us the use of school facilities to do our fund raising and allowed us to do lots of fund raising because Botball is a very expensive.
